

Revision sheet for the Year 9 French exam (ASW)

The overall end of year marks will be made up as follows:

- **Half-term vocabulary tests** 25%)
- **Listening test** 25%) =100%
- **Written exam** 50%)

If you miss any of the five half-term vocabulary tests, your score will be averaged out. The listening test will take place in a French lesson during the week before half term. The listening test and the written exam will test you on all you have done in the first four units of Tricolore 3 and will last one hour and twenty minutes.

You should revise vocabulary and grammar. The vocabulary can be found on the blue summary pages at the end of each of the four units. The relevant grammar points are in the Dossier-Langue sections which are to be found on the following pages:

The written exam will include exercises similar to ones you have done in class and on worksheets. You will need to know the present, perfect and imperfect tenses of –er, -ir, and –re verbs and of the irregular verbs on the back of this sheet. Some parts of the exam will require you to write out verb forms in these tenses.

You should also familiarise yourself with the list of jobs on p58 and the green *Pour t'aider* sections in the first four units.

You will also be required to write short paragraphs (about 30 words) on the following subjects:

- Describing a friend (physical appearance and character).**
- Talking about your leisure activities (what you do, how often etc).**
- Saying what school subjects you like and dislike and why.**
- Talking about a school trip you went on using the past tenses.**

You will be expected to prepare these in advance.
